

## **All Saints Anglican Church, Exeter.**

### ***The Beginnings.***

All Saints, the small country church at Exeter, began as part of the Parish of Beaconsfield with parishioners holding services in homes.

In 1910 Mr. Southerwood, the local publican, donated land for the building of a church and from thereon the West Tamar Mission conducted regular services in halls, schools and packing sheds at Rosevears, Exeter, West and East Glengarry, Frankford, Gravelly Beach and Bridgenorth.

In 1916 the building began with men carrying gravel and stone up the goat track and the foundation stone was laid.

In 1927 the church was officially consecrated and has been used for regular services ever since.

In 1940 All Saints established an equal partnership with Holy Trinity at Beaconsfield and we are now the West Tamar Anglican Parish.
